DROUGHT MANAGEMENT POLICY

- It is not in place
- What is in place is a National Disaster Management Policy of 2005
- National Disaster Management Policy is operationalized through the Disaster Management Operations Manual which summarizes the roles, responsibilities and procedures relating to the management of Disasters, particularly drought

Disaster Management Unit (DMMU)

- The DMMU is under the Office of the vice president
- It coordinates and collaborates with all stakeholders in disaster management
- Disaster actions and responses falls on it
- Thus drought response also falls under DMMU
- Mainly re-active in response

How Droughts Have Affected Zambia

- Agriculture most affected (crops, livestock, grazing fields)
 - Especially the southern region of Zambia
- Water availability in rural areas reduced

Gov't's and People's actions

- Building dams for irrigation in the southern region
 - Irrigation policy has been put in place
- Drought resistant crops & conservation farming being promoted
- Boleholes are being dug
- People in the southern region are migrating to the northern region
- Provision of accurate weather and climate forecasts by ZMD
- Identification of drought prone areas
